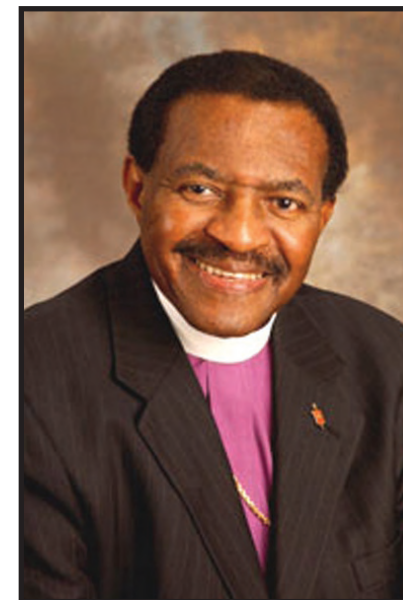

As preacher, activist, Bishop or General Secretary, Woodie W. White's passion has



always included a ministry of racial justice. Born in 1930s Harlem, Bishop White struggled against hardship and intolerance to become one of the most respected religious leaders in the United States. A graduate of Boston University School

of Theology in 1961, he pastored in Worcester, Massachusetts, and Detroit, Michigan, during the height of the Civil Rights Movement. He was jailed for attempting to worship at Saint Luke's Methodist Church in Jackson, Mississippi, but was welcomed back nearly three decades later by the predominately white congregation as a guest preacher.

Bishop White led the General Commission on Religion and Race for its first 15 years, and, in 1996-97, was President of The United Methodist Church's Council of Bishops. The author of three books, including *Racial Transition in the Church*, he teaches at Emory University's Candler School of Theology, in Atlanta, and writes regularly published newspaper commentaries.
