The United 10 Methodist Church recognizes that the sin of racism has been destructive to its unity throughout 11 its history. Racism continues to cause painful division and marginalization. The United 12 13 Methodist Church shall confront and seek to eliminate racism, whether in organizations or in individuals, in every facet of its life and in society at large. The United Methodist Church shall 14 work collaboratively with others to address concerns that threaten the cause of racial justice at all 15 times and in all places. Racism opposes God's law, goodness and love and diminishes the image 16 of God in each person. Fueled by white privilege, white supremacy and colonialism, the sin of 17 racism has been a destructive scourge on global society and throughout the history of The United 18 19 Methodist Church. It continues to destroy our communities, harm persons, obstruct unity and 20 undermine God's work in this world. Racism must be eradicated. Therefore, The United Methodist Church commits to confronting and eliminating all forms of racism, racial inequity, 21 22 colonialism, white privilege and white supremacy, in every facet of its life and in society at 23 <u>large.</u>
